YOUTH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM FOR YOUTH LIVING WITH HIV

AIDS Alabama South was awarded a \$150,000 two-year grant by ViiV Healthcare, Inc., to help establish a direct mentorship and leadership development program to improve health outcomes for youth (aged 13 – 24) living with and impacted by HIV.

In addition, the grant will also enable AIDS Alabama South to serve as a monthly supportive resource for parents, guardians and other loved ones - where researchers, service providers, mentors, and AIDS Alabama South staff can present HIV data, receive feedback, and everyone can ask questions. The monthly supportive program will be called, Koffee Kupp.

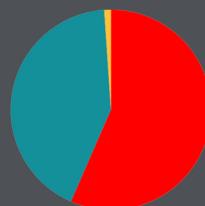

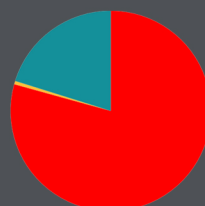
